### **Fr. Steve's Quotes for Consideration:**

Every pastor typically has some form of column in the weekly parish bulletin, and this column is usually used to talk about current events in the Church, share Church teaching or exhort the faithful to greater participation in Church life and events. My hope is to accomplish that through this column, entitled, "Quotes for Consideration."
